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#### **HIGHLIGHTS OF TERM 2 & KEY ACTIVITIES**





# Remembering Mr Lee Kuan Yew one year on ...

Through the activities held during the first week of term 2, pupils and staff remembered how our nation had come together, and to reflect on the values that the late Mr Lee Kuan Yew and his generation represented. These values continue to bond us as one people as we work on our future together.



Pupils and staff wrote their names on thick rubber bands and these were used to form a long chain. The chain symbolises how we are all intertwined regardless of race, religion and age and how we need to stay united for the future. Pupils and staff also penned down their reflections on our Founding Prime Minister and attached these reflections onto the long chain that was formed. The lower primary pupils wrote 3 words to describe Mr Lee Kuan Yew while the upper primary pupils wrote on the 3 things they have learnt from Mr Lee Kuan Yew. Pupils also penned poems in remembrance of Mr Lee.





#### Earth Hour 2016







Earth Hour is a charitable organisation based out of Singapore. It was famously started as a lights-off event in Sydney, Australia in 2007. Since then it has grown to engage more than 172 countries and territories worldwide. Earth Hour 2016 was on 19 March 2016, 8:30 pm.

Temasek Primary School celebrated Earth hour on 24 March 2016. All pupils and staff were encouraged to turn off the lights, fans and air-conditioners to minimise electricity usage and to experience learning in classrooms without electricity. Though the 30 minutes was uncomfortable, pupils understood that this could become a reality if we do not conserve our natural resources. Teachers were also involved conversing with our pupils regarding environmental issues.

# Mother Tongue Fortnight Activities by the Malay Language Team



Our Primary 5 and 6 Malay language pupils had a chance to eat Nasi Ambeng together in a 'kenduri' manner. They learned the significance of sharing food with other people while enjoying their tray of Nasi Ambeng. Nasi Ambeng is served on a tray and eaten by 4 to 5 people so as to encourage camaraderie. In the olden days, Nasi Ambeng was served only during special occasions by the rich as they served expensive dishes such as beef rendang and opor chicken in the Nasi Ambeng. Guests who are invited would just have a mouthful of the food and then would bring home the rest of it by equally portioning it with the others who share the tray with them.

Our Primary 1 to 4 pupils learned more about Malay traditional kuih. Our primary 1 and 2 pupils were taught mainly on the different methods of making Malay traditional kuih - boiling, baking, steaming and frying. Our primary 3 and 4 pupils were taught about the use of pandan leaves, coconut leaves and coconut which can be found in numerous Malay traditional kuih. All our primary 1 to 4 pupils had a chance to try the kuih and they were delighted with the delicious kuih!

# English Week @ Temasek - 28 March to 1 April 2016

This year, EL Week returned with a bang in Term 2. With the new '3D Book Cover Design' competition being introduced, the winning entries were given air time in the canteen, hanging in the tree to form Temasek's very own 'Tree of Knowledge'. The competitions were the first activities to kick-start the fun-filled week of other various EL activities aimed at exposing pupils to the use of English, recognising the importance of speaking, and communicating in Standard English.













Pupils participated in the various fun and educational activities catered for their levels. With the rostering of classes to play during recess times, they had ample opportunities to play and more pupils were able to complete the activities. They enjoyed the games and activities which was evident in the smiles on their faces as they moved from station to station.

#### **Temasek Resilience Run 2016**

# **My Garden of Character Project**

The school collaborated with the Parent Connection Committee (PCC) in a new project called 'My Garden of Character'. Values and Habits are weaved into this special project. The project is implemented at two stages, firstly at the lower primary class level and eventually at the school-wide level where a plot of land will be set aside for the parents to oversee the planting and gardening activities as well as engage pupils in meaningful activities. Members in the PCC and parent volunteers acted as character and green ambassadors, well attired in green, to conduct the lessons.



#### **Celebrate Earth Day**



Earth Day is a movement that hopes to inspire, challenge ideas, ignite passion, and motivate people to action for the environment. In Singapore, aligned to Earth Day, an annual international environmental event on 22 April, Youth for the Environment Day (YED) engaged the youth to champion environmental ownership and to renew their commitment to care for the environment. Pupils in Temasek were encouraged to recycle plastic drinking bottles which they decorated with creative designs. These bottles were then used as pots for plants which will be hung around the school.

# International Friendship Day



This year's International Friendship Day (IFD) was commemorated on 8 April 2016 on the same day as our Resilience Run. The theme for this year's IFD was Singapore and ASEAN and hence, the activities and sharing were focused on ASEAN countries.

Every year, before the IFD assembly programmes, our NE Ambassadors will walk into the hall with flags of various countries. This year, during the P1 and P2 assembly, the P1 and P2 form teachers themselves sportingly took part in the flag parade. They looked like they really enjoyed themselves! During the recess activities carried out over three days from Tuesday to

Thursday, our pupils had a chance to see, touch and take photos with the flags. They also learned about ASEAN by looking at exhibits of items from ASEAN as well as the map of ASEAN. The most popular activity was at the drawing and colouring station. Pupils had to draw and colour the flags of two ASEAN countries in order to win a country flag eraser. The activity was so popular that all 600 flag erasers were redeemed! Our PCC members and parent volunteers helped to run the activities during the various recesses.





# **Drink Water Campaign**

Temasek's Talent Fiesta (Performing Arts) was held on Wednesday, 13 April and Thursday, 14 April during the morning assembly for our Primary 3 to Primary 6 pupils. Temasek Talent Fiesta is slated to be held twice a year to showcase pupils' talents. It is also a platform for pupils to gain confidence by performing in front of their peers. The fiesta will be a springboard for talented pupils to perform to a wider audience during official school events like Speech Day and Temasek MagicLand. The response was overwhelming, thus there were more participants than performance slots. The participants that had not performed were given opportunities to perform during Temasek MagicLand.


# Temasek's Very Own Budding Actress - 'Little Emily'

We are integrating technology into the curriculum especially in the field of robotics to develop future ready individuals through applicative learning experiences such as our school's RMA involvement in designing a Cospace package on the Diversity of Materials with Singapore Polytechnic



team led by Dr Zhou and Ms Shen Jiayao for our P4 pupils this year. We are also in the midst of developing our 2nd package and are looking forward to its implementation. With this, Temasek Primary School aspires to be a vibrant robotics learning centre where we hope to develop pupils into passionate, creative, as well as critical thinkers through the continuous integration of robotics into the curriculum.

#### **Singapore Amazing Flying Machine Competition 2016**




