Singapore Bids Farewell to Former President S.R.Nathan





As a mark of respect to Mr S. R. Nathan, the State flag and the school flag were flown at half-mast from 23 August to 26 August. Pupils had the opportunity to reflect and pen their thoughts as a tribute to the late Mr S.R.Nathan. These reflections, coupled with newspaper articles and print-outs of photographs Temasek staff have taken with Mr Nathan, were put up on display boards in the canteen so that these reflections and experiences can be shared. 5 pupils and 5 staff members attended the the Lying-in-State at the Parliament House. They represented the school and Three of our pupils were interviewed by the media and their reflections and sharing were captured and published. The visit was a good opportunity for pupils and staff to appreciate the contributions and sacrifices that Mr S.R. Nathan had made. It is also hoped that these pupils will be inspired to live up to the same ideals.

This year, the National Day celebrations kick-started with the National Day Drawing Competition on this year's theme of 'Building our Singapore of Tomorrow'. The school received many interesting and very forward-looking submissions from our Temasekians.

During this year's MagicLand, we also included a National Day competition element in SingaLand whereby pupils depicted their 'Singapore of Tomorrow' using Lego pieces. Through this activity, we surfaced 10 winners who were acknowledged during the National Day Celebrations.





The celebrations continued on Monday, 8 August 2016, with the National Day Observance Ceremony. The National Day Message by Mr Ng Chee Meng, Acting Minister for (Schools) Education, was delivered by Mr Foo that morning. In his message, he highlighted despite forgetting the challenges faced by our forefathers, they showed us that no matter how uncertain or difficult life may be, we can succeed if we work together as one people. Through the citing of various examples, he then called out to all pupils to think of ways they can make a difference to others - at home, in school and in our community. They have an important role to play in our Singapore story. Together, 'We' will Build our Singapore of Tomorrow – a Singapore we will all be proud of.

To commemorate this day, we had performances by the school's choir and also a segment by Total Vocal. This was followed by the various segments of community singing led by our teachers. The quiz questions and games posed on that day also created opportunities for the pupils to test their knowledge on Singapore and if they actually remembered the lyrics to the popular National Day songs. To share this joyous occasion, we also had residents from the Lions Home with us that morning. They had a memorable time as they sang along to songs like "Chan Mali Chan" during the concert and when they interacted with the P5 and P6 NE Ambassadors throughout that day.

Racial Harmony Day 2016

Commemorated annually on 21 July 2016, Racial Harmony Day (RHD) signifies and reminds our pupils of the importance of racial harmony, respect, empathy and cross-cultural skills. In Temasek Primary, RHD was commemorated on 19 July for the P1 to P4 pupils and on 21 July for the P5 and P6 pupils. On both days, the assembly presentation focused on knowing information about festivals, food and clothing that are unique to each race. P3, P4 and P5 NE Ambassadors also took to the stage and performed the "CIEMO, CIEMO" dance which includes traditional moves from each of the various races in Singapore.



The RHD commemoration on 21 July was also made more memorable for our pupils as they were treated to a performance by both the Malawi and Taiwanese visitors. The Malawi visitors shared about their homeland, Malawi, and the joys and difficulties in the learning of Chinese. They also performed martial arts. The Taiwanese visitors performed a Hakka song, with some of them wearing their traditional aboriginal costumes.

Visit by Taiwan Delegates

The pupils were assigned to the P4 and P5 classes to be immersed in the classrooms and they also had lessons on robotics.

Taiwan Immersion Programme

From 21-22 July 2016, a group of pupils and teachers from National University of Tainan Affliated Primary School came to Temasek Primary for a 2-day immersion programme. They were accompanied by their principal and 6 other teachers.





The pupils, aged between 10 and 12 years old, were attached to the P4 and P5 levels. Each pupil was assigned a Temasek buddy and all of them had a fun-filled 2-day Temasek experience in class. Not only did the Taiwanese students attend our Racial Harmony commemorative event in the hall, they also performed a Taiwanese tribal dance as an introductory item upon their arrival.



On the second day, a customised Robotics lessons was conducted by our ICT HOD, Mdm Marlini, for the Taiwanese pupils and teachers. They enjoyed the lessons tremendously and were envious that we had the expertise and infrastructure to allow every child in Temasek to experience Robotics lessons.

Their Master Teacher, Ms Wen Mei Yu, who is well-known for her teaching and learning pedagogies, also delivered a 90 – minute comprehension lesson for our P5 HCL pupils. Both teachers and pupils gained wonderful insights during the lesson and everyone had a fruitful and meaningful immersion experience.

160 of our Primary Three pupils hosted an equal number of Primary Three pupils from the Singapore Japanese School (Changi Campus) during their visit to Temasek Primary on Tuesday, 12 July 2016. Both pupils from Temasek Primary and the Singapore Japanese School wrote introduction cards and had a chance to meaningfully interact through playing our traditional games of five stones, kuti-kuti, pick-up sticks and chopstick marbles. These games were facilitated by the P6 NE Ambassadors and pupils from Primary 4B. The P3 pupils then collaborated in the mass Art activity which featured the various traditional costumes of the various races.

On Friday, 22 July 2016, the P3 pupils from Primary 3B, 3C, 3D and 3E visited the Singapore Japanese School and had the chance to learn more about the Japanese culture through their interaction with the Japanese pupils when they played various games like "the string game" and paper spinning tops, as well as in the making of "origami".

Science Week

Science Week 2016 was held from 25 July to 29 July. It was a collaborative effort amongst the Science department teachers to design and construct fun and exciting pupil – centered activities to engage our pupils in the learning of Science outside the classroom.

Parent volunteers and PCC members also came forward to engage our P3 to P6 students in fun-filled yet enriching Science activities. According to some of them, it was an opportunity for them to revisit Science concepts. Student participants were engaged and had lots of fun learning Science through the activities. They found the activities engaging and experiments interesting and tried their best in the challenges posed to them.









Science week was also an opportunity for students to lead their peers. Our P4 and P5 student leaders took the lead in conducting some of the activities for their peers.

Science Week also provided a platform for pupils to present their learning to their peers and in turn, enthuse and excite them further about Science. Pupils who took part in the Flying Machine Competition, Sony Toy Competition, Tinkering Workshop and Learning Tapestry Projects shared their work with other students. The peer sharing allowed them to share with other children about their experiences and conceptual learning.







The Edibles Garden

In 2014, Lisianne Chan, Jessie Cheong and Annabelle Tan from Temasek Primary School took part in a competition called "Shop for Your School". Students were required to come up with a proposal to improve their school or community and create a wish list on how the money would be spent. The three girls came up with the idea to construct a vegetable garden in the school to raise funds for the needy. They won second place with a prize money of \$3000 to make their proposal a reality. With the help of their teachers, a small garden and hydroponics system was set up in the old peacock cage. The girls started to grow edible vegetables to raise funds that were eventually donated to the Lions Home for The Elders.

P2 to P6 Service Learning

P2 -Team Clean Up

This year, the title for the Primary 2 Service Learning Project was 'Team Clean Up!' The children planned a clean-up roster with different cleaning activities. The goal is to effectively make use of the 5 minutes of clean up time at the end of each day for pupils to do their part to keep the classrooms clean. The list ranges from cleaning up the floor and



tables using the handheld broom and dustpan, to emptying the bins and watering the plants, amongst other things. With the roster, the pupils are more aware of what to do each day and get to experience different tasks throughout the week. Most importantly, they understood the purpose of cleaning up their own classrooms and were happy that they could help the cleaning ladies lighten some of their work – load.

P3 – Buddy Clean Workshop & Young Environmentalists

In line with the 'Keep Singapore Clean Movement' in Schools, Temasek Primary School collaborated with NEA and embarked on a capacity – building workshop titled 'Buddy Clean Workshop' as part of the Service Learning programme for the Primary 3 students. The aim of this collaboration was to inculcate positive social values and norms on cleanliness amongst students. The project leveraged on peer influence and feedback to shape behaviour and foster shared ownership and responsibility of common spaces through regular cohort-wide cleaning. The Primary 3 pupils too embarked on a Service Learning Project titled "The Young Environmentalist", where the pupils were involved in a recycling-cum-charity initiative to raise funds for the needy Temasekians. Over a period of 2 weeks, the Primary 3 pupils actively brought old newspapers to school. These newspapers were sold to the rag and bone man on 21 July and the money raised would be used to assist our fellow needy Temasekians. Through this movement, we hope the pupils would develop a sense of responsibility and care for both the environment and the people around us.







P4 –The Food Angels (Assisting Food from the Heart)



For Service Learning this year, the P4 leaders demonstrated the school values of charity and responsibility and put into action Habit 5. They recognised the needs of the less fortunate and collaborated with Food from the Heart by donating non-perishable food items. These food items that the leaders collected were donated to the needy families around Singapore. A total of 1800 families benefited from this project. Through this project, the leaders have also learnt that nobody owes Singapore a living and that we, ourselves, must do our part to help and support one another.

P5 – The Hamper Builders

The Primary Five students prepared hampers for four children's homes this year. The homes are Pertapis Children's Home, Darul Ihsan Orphanage, Jamiyah Children's Home and Ramakrishna Mission. The students donated food items such as Milo, biscuits and instant noodles. They also donated toiletries such as body wash, facial wash, deodorant, combs and hair ties for girls. The students were generous in their donations and worked in groups to wrap the hampers. These beautifully wrapped gift hampers were then donated to the various homes in time for National Day. Some of the students also prepared cards for the residents of these homes. These cards contained their well wishes to the children and hope that the children would have a meaningful National Day. The Primary Five students learnt how to be charitable during this Service Learning Project and realised the importance of giving back to the less fortunate in our community.





P6 - Young Heroes for the Old





Our Primary 6 pupils were engaged in a Service Learning Project to bring cheer to the elderly at Lions Home for the Elders. They donated items such as Milo, instant noodles, milk powder, shampoo, T-shirts and towels. These items had been requested by the Home. Pupils also designed beautiful cards to send their well wishes to the residents of the Home. Using beautiful wrapping papers, the pupils wrapped some recycled boxes to turn them into presentable gift boxes. Some of the donated items were placed into these gift boxes while others were packed into bags. While the service learning project focused on Habit 5 - Seek First to Understand Then to Be Understood, pupils also learnt to apply Habit 6 - Synergise, when they worked together in sorting the donated items and packing them into the boxes and bags. Through this service learning project, the Primary 6 pupils also learnt the values of responsibility, respect and charity, and the importance of giving to the less fortunate. The project was also in line with the school's Service Learning Vision - Nurturing a Generous Generation.

Values in Action – Aesthetics CCA Groups

The Aesthetics CCA groups (Art Club, Choir, Guitar Club and Dance Club) embarked on a Values In Action (VIA) programme incorporating the appreciation of the arts in Temasek Primary. A group of pupils from each CCA painted murals related to their CCA on the walls. Such a programme will make it meaningful for all pupils as they take ownership for designing and painting the designated wall murals.





Let's Say Thank You - A Project by Ngee Ann Polytechnic




A group of Ngee Ann Polytechnic students called the 'Knighteen Events' collaborated with Temasek Primary School to conduct a Gratitude Project which is aligned with the habit and value of the month (Consideration and Habit 5 – Seek First To Understand Than To Be Understood).

The students prepared fun activities that were conducted during the level recesses at the Gratitude Carnival on 27 July 2016. However, pre-carnival activities began the week before. While the project was targeted at the P3 and P4 levels, the Gratitude Carnival and one other activity (*Love Letter*) were conducted for all the levels.

For the *Love Letter* activity, eight "Mail Boxes" were placed in the canteen. The boxes were for each of the canteen stalls. The objective of this activity is to show gratitude to the canteen vendors for always providing food and drinks to our pupils.
