# Temasek Community Garden

The Temasek Community Garden has been completed at the start of 2018. It is an outdoor laboratory with a diverse variety of plants and animals. It is created to allow students to observe and learn about nature in a landscape garden environment. There are about 55 different species of plants in the garden. The garden serves to inspire pupils to cultivate a respect for nature through an appreciation of plants in their various stages of growth. The community garden is divided into four different themes: Herb Garden, Fruit Paradise, Vegetable Farm and Flower Towers. It showcases an assortment of plants, from flowers such as hibiscus and morning glory to vegetables such as cucumbers, capsicum, onions and fruits such as papayas, bananas, golden apples etc. Take a walk around and one can discover more about the plants that one seldom sees.



The community garden is jointly maintained by students from Club Eureka, teachers, Parent Connection Committee members and Parent Volunteers. It is a place where teachers, students and parents can mingle and interact. The edible harvests will be shared among the community and donated to the Lions Home for the Elders, to instill a sense of duty, empathy and foster community spirit in the students. The community garden also serves as a learning hub for gardening knowledge and skills, and also as an outdoor education where students have the opportunity to germinate and harvest herbs and fruits. It also promotes experiential learning and serves to motivate students in the learning and reinforcement of school values. From the caring of the plants, the students develop a sense of responsibility and purposefulness.



# **Primary 4**

Our P4 students went on a Heritage Learning Journey to be exposed to and appreciate the art works of our very own local artists. The places they visited for this learning journey were the Wall Murals at Waterloo Street, Graffiti Wall at Queen Street and the National Museum of Singapore. Through this learning journey, students learnt about Singapore's historical past. They were able to appreciate the cultural diversity in Singapore through the paintings, installation and digital art works that were displayed.

#### **Primary 6**







On 29 January and 1 February, the P6 students went on a NE Heritage Learning Journey to Chinatown. Through the learning journey the students were able to appreciate the cultural diversity of the different ethnic communities, understand the importance of groups and individuals in the community, learn about barter trade and how human activities affect the development of a community. Students also learnt more about the Chinese culture, cuisine and religion, as well as the legacy left behind by the Chinese settlers in Singapore.

Before I went to Chinatown, I did not know that the Thian Hock Keng temple was actually so huge and that there were different deities in the temple. I learnt that all the deities in the temple have different roles. I was also fascinated to learn that the early immigrants who arrived from China to Singapore faced a lot of difficulties. Almost 10000 of them had to squeeze into one boat and the journey lasted for about 2 to 3 weeks. I was told that the Samsui women, who came to Singapore to work were as young as 10 years old! These prefects represent the student body and uphold the image of the school. They also guide the Junior Prefects in serving the school and ensure that leadership succession is in place. Our Principal, Mrs Ho, addressed the school and specifically, the student leaders of the Prefect Council, on the importance of taking on leadership roles and the desired attributes of an effective student leader before presenting the appointment letters to the executive committee leaders.

The newly elected Head Prefect, Shernice Ng of 6A and the 4 Deputy Head Prefects, Ryan Johan of 6A, Kaylene Chan of 6A, Ryka Danani of 6B and Eugene Cheong of 6B were also introduced to the school during the ceremony. ## **Primary 5 Camp (Young Explorer Outdoor Education)**

The P5 students went for a 3 Days 2 Nights camp from 5 March to 7 March 2018 at Camp Challenge (Sentosa) as part of their Temasek Young Explorer Outdoor Education curriculum. It was the first outdoor adventure camp for many of the students and they looked forward to it. It was indeed a memorable experience as they were exposed to various challenges such as orienteering around Sentosa Island with a map, compass and pace counter. The students and teachers were tired after trekking for 2 to 3 hours but the feeling of accomplishment made it all worthwhile. The students were also engaged in outdoor cooking and had a taste of honey popcorn and toast bread. To round up the camp experience, they participated in team bonding games by the beach, low element and mega catapult challenge. The highlight of the camp had to be the campfire where students and camp coaches put up performances to the delight of the audience. It was certainly a memorable and enriching camp for our students.







#### **Primary 4 Young Explorer (exploring Bedok South Neighbourhood)**

On 5 March 2018, the P4 students had the opportunity to apply the navigational skills that they had been taught during their PE lessons. Working in groups, they had to locate six different checkpoints based on the map provided and complete a task at each checkpoint. While the students went about their tasks, they also had to apply good neighbourhood exploration habits such as showing consideration for the residents staying nearby by being mindful of their noise level. They also learnt to care for the environment by picking up litter that they saw along the way. and be concerned citizens as they learnt about the important people (eg. MPs) who are looking after the constituency where the school is located.


# **Primary 6 Sports Fiesta**

#### **OVERSEAS VISITORS**

#### **Delegates learning about Temasek Primary's STEM Education**

On 2 February 2018, two esteemed principals from Taiwan, Mr Fan Yang-Hsun and Mr Yu Chih-Hung, from Dong Xing and Shakeng Elementary School respectively, visited our school. They were interested to learn about our school's STEM education, especially our applied learning programme and how we have incorporated it into our curriculum. They observed one of our Primary 4 classes where Mr Lim Wu Yi conducted a STEM lesson integrating our Life Science Programme lesson which enabled the students to use the concept of proportion to solve the problem given to them. Mr Lim planned key questions to ask during the various stages of the lesson. The scenario was designed for the students to transfer key concepts and apply the knowledge they have learnt to a real world situation. Microbits were used to engage the students in their learning for them to be attentive, motivated and actively involved in the learning process. It encouraged ownership of their own learning when they related it to their personal experiences.









Students were also given the flexibility to experiment with different parameters in the coding to achieve the objective. This enabled them to explore and provide different solutions to the scenario with their team members, hence enhancing collaborative and thinking skills. This process enabled the students to be involved in decision making, to make intellectual risks, and to view mistakes as learning opportunities. The students also provided evidence of their learning where they wrote their findings for the teacher to provide feedback.

The principals also visited the Innovation Lab to observe a P1 PAL Robotics lesson, facilitated by Ms Poonam and Miss Jocelyn Goh. Our school leaders and teachers had a meaningful discussion with the Taiwanese visitors where we exchanged pointers on STEM education. Through the discussion, the principals were keen to adopt some of these ideas to kick start the STEM education in their own schools.

#### **Taiwanese Immersion Programme**

A group of students and staff from Taipei Jian Kang Elementary School visited the school on a three-day immersion programme from 29 January 2018 to 31 January 2018. During their visit, our P5 students were assigned as buddies to the Taiwanese students to help them ease into our school as they joined them in their learning. Apart from the classroom lessons, our Taiwanese visitors were also engaged in interesting lessons in Robotics, Augmented Reality and the Arts.

Throughout their three-day visit, our P5 buddies played good hosts to the Taiwanese students. On the last day of the immersion programme, the buddies put up the CEIMO dance, which is unique to Singapore, for our visitors. They also exchanged gifts with one other to mark their newly established friendship.
